Class C Motorhomes are built on a Van Cut-a-way Chassis with an overhead bunk above the driver's seat.



What is a Class C Motorhome?

Motorhomes are divided into several different classes based on their chassis, for now we'll only discuss how to identify a Class C Motorhome or Class C Recreational Vehicle.

Class C motorhomes are built on top of a full-sized van chassis, where only the truck cab and frame are there to start. A Class C RV will have an overhang from the living or home portion of the coach, typically containing a bunk/sleeping quarters.

More about Class C Motorhomes:

Class C recreational vehicles are the most commonly sold motorhome in North America. These motorhomes commonly are available in lengths from 22' up to 31 feet, comfortably sleep anywhere from 3 to 6 people. Most people find that C Class RVs are fairly easy to drive due to their relatively small size and the use of the van-style chassis.
